MARITAL RAPE A GROUND FOR DIVORCE, RULES KERALA HC

• Kerala High Court, in a significant judgment, upheld that marital rape, although not penalised in India, is a good ground to claim divorce.

> Court observed that a spouse in a marriage has a choice, a choice not to suffer, which is fundamental to the autonomy guaranteed under natural law and the Constitution.

> Law cannot compel a spouse to suffer against his or her wish by denial of divorce by the court.

Section 375 of the Indian penal Code (IPC) exempts unwilling sexual intercourse between a husband and a wife over 18 years of age from Section 375's definition of "rape" and thus immunizes such acts from prosecution.

- India is one of only 36 countries where marital rape is not a legal crime.
 - ➤ In 2013, the UN Committee on Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) recommended that the Indian government should criminalize marital rape.
 - The JS Verma committee set up in the aftermath of nationwide protests after 2012 gang rape case had also recommended the same.

○ Legal provisions available to women

- > Section 498A deals with women being subjected to cruelty by her husband or any relative of her husband.
- ➤ Domestic Violence Act, 2005 recognises forced sexual activity as punishable under the Indian law.
 - » However, a magistrate under the law has absolutely no power to criminalise the act of a man raping his wife, neither can the man be sentenced.

MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS LAUNCHES SIXTH BID ROUND OF OPEN ACREAGE LICENSING PROGRAMME (OALP)

 Under Hydrocarbon Exploration and Licensing Policy (HELP), OALP mechanism has been launched to boost domestic hydrocarbon production.

OALP gives an option to a company looking for exploring hydrocarbons to select the exploration blocks on its own, without waiting for the formal bid round from the Government.

- > India's domestic energy production has been low.
 - Crude, oil and gas production fell 5.22% and 8.06% respectively in the last financial year.
 - ➤ Bid Round-VI is expected to add further 35,346 sq. km, taking the total area for exploration to 191,926 sq. km. under the HELP regime.
- HELP was unveiled in 2016 that replaced the New Exploration Licensing Policy (NELP).
- How HELP is better than NELP
 - > Single License for all Hydrocarbons instead of separate licenses in NELP.
 - > Revenue Sharing Model instead of profit sharing in NELP.
 - > Pricing & Marketing Freedom.
 - > Lower Royalty Rates (Varies from 2% in Ultra-Deep Offshore to 12.5% Onland) with no royalty for the first 7 years incase of deep-sea drilling.
 - > Further concession in Royalty Rates for Early Production.
 - > Simplified Dispute Resolution Mechanism.





SCIENTISTS FROM FOUR BRICS COUNTRIES TO CARRY OUT GENOMIC SEQUENCING OF THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC

- Indian Scientists, in partnership with Scientists from China, Russia and Brazil, will carry out genomic sequencing of SARS-CoV-2 to help trace genetic mutations and also make projections about the future of its spread using mathematical modelling.
 - ➤ Under this research, supported by Department of Science and Technology, India and Brazil will assess distribution of SARS-CoV-2 in environmental samples.
 - ➤ Chinese and Russian scientists will carry out Real-Time PCR detection of SARS-CoV-2 in biological material (nasal swabs) from patients.
- Genome sequencing means deciphering the exact order of base pairs (refer infographic) in an individual.
 - ➤ A genome is an organism's complete set of DNA. It includes all chromosomes, which houses DNA, and genes (specific sections of DNA).



- > BRICS is an acronym for 5 emerging economies of the world viz. Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa.
- > They comprise 41% of world population, having 24% of world GDP and over 16% share in world trade.
- > India will host the 13th BRICS summit, which also marks the 15th anniversary of the grouping.

CHINA BEGINS NAVAL EXERCISES IN SOUTH CHINA SEA (SCS)

- China has begun **five-day-long naval drills in the disputed SCS**, amid the military exercises being conducted by the US in the Indo-Pacific.
 - The Indian Navy is also deploying a naval task group to the SCS, Western Pacific and South East Asia aimed at enhancing its profile in the strategically key sea lanes.
 - > Recently, India at the 11th East Asia Summit (EAS) Stressed that Code of Conduct on the SCS should be fully consistent with UNCLOS 1982.

Importance of SCS

- > Strategic Location: It is a key sea lane of communication connecting Asia with Europe and Africa.
- > Natural Resource: The SCS is believed to contain major reserves of natural gas and oil.
 - > ONGC Videsh, the overseas arm of Oil and Natural Gas Corp. Ltd (ONGC) has a presence in Vietnam through 45% and 100% stakes in 2 hydrocarbon blocks.


• Issues with South SCS

- > Territorial conflict (refer infographic).
- > Violation of International rules: In 2016, China rejected UNCLOS Arbitral Tribunal ruling which said that China cannot claim historic rights to resources in the waters within a "nine-dash line" encompassing much of SCS.

O About UNCLOS

- ➤ It is an international agreement that resulted from the third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS III).
- ➤ It defines the rights and responsibilities of nations with respect to their use of the world's oceans, establishing guidelines for businesses, the environment, and the management of marine natural resources.
- ➤ India signed the Convention in 1982 and ratified in 1995.





PM SUGGESTS 4-POINT STRATEGY TO ACHIEVE \$400-B EXPORTS IN FY22

- The Prime Minister listed four factors to boost exports and urged all stakeholders to identify 75 new products and destinations to broad base exports to mark 75th Independence Day.
 - > Increasing quality competent manufacturing.
 - Centre and States to put in effort to sort out logistical problems.
 - > Strengthening coordination between exporters and government.
 - > Finding more global markets for Indian products.
- At present, India's exports constitute 20% of GDP.
 - > Diversification is necessary as **India's exports comprised items from just a handful of sectors** such as petroleum
 products, gems & jewellery, engineering
 goods and pharmaceuticals.
 - > Top 3 Export Destinations for India: USA, China, UAE.

• Export promotion schemes by government

- Services Exports from India Scheme (SEIS) under Foreign Trade Policy for increasing exports of services.
- > Remission of Duties and Taxes on Export Product (RoDTEP) - to replace existing Merchandise Exports from India Scheme for exports of goods from India.
- ➤ Trade Infrastructure for Export Scheme (TIES).
- > Agriculture Export Policy, 2018.
- Niryat Bandhu Scheme to reach out to new and potential exporters.



CESL ISSUES FIRST-OF-ITS-KIND TENDER FOR PROCUREMENT OF 1 LAKH ELECTRIC THREE-WHEELERS (E3W)

 Convergence Energy Services Limited (CESL), a subsidiary of Energy Efficiency Services Limited invited proposals for E3W from original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) to use E3W in municipal solid waste collection, freight loaders, food and vaccine transport and passenger autos.

> Deployment of E3Ws for refrigerated cold storage and vaccine drives can help make India's COVID recovery green and eco-friendly.

> Further, all E3Ws have to comply with Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles in India Phase II (FAME II) policy requirements.

- CESL has been supported by USAID's Smart Power for Advancing Reliability and Connectivity (SPARC) Program.
 - > It is a **three year bi-lateral program** of USAID with Ministry of Power **to modernize electricity distribution utilities to improve their performance.**
- FAME was notified in 2015 under Department of Heavy Industries as part of National Electric Mobility Mission Plan 2020 to support hybrid/electric vehicles market development and Manufacturing eco-system.
 - > Phase 2 of FAME (2019 to 2022) has been given an outlay of ₹10,000 crores to generate demand by way of supporting e-Buses, e-3 Wheelers, e-4 Wheeler Passenger Car.



- The meeting was hosted by Italy and it adopted a declaration for "Leveraging Digitalization for a Resilient, Strong, Sustainable and Inclusive Recovery".
- Steps taken towards digitization in India
 - > Digital India Mission.
 - > Providing digital identity Aadhaar to 1.29 billion users, opening bank accounts of 430 million poor people, Direct benefit Transfer etc.
- G20 is an informal group of 19 countries and the European Union.
 - It represents two-thirds of world's population and 85% of global gross domestic product.
- Recently, Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) of the Reserve Bank of India decided to keep the policy rate unchanged at 4% despite upward revision in the inflation forecast reflecting the dilemma of stagflation.
 Stagflation is an economic situation in which the inflation rate is high, economic growth rate slows, and unemployment remains steadily high.
 - It creates a dilemma for government since most actions designed to lower inflation may raise unemployment levels, and policies designed to decrease unemployment may worsen inflation.
 - It is an **e-certification program** launched by the Ministry of Power **to provide regulatory training to the practitioners** from diverse backgrounds.
 - Also, a **Regulatory Data Dashboard** was launched, which is an **e-compendium of data containing State-wise details of tariff and DISCOM performance.**
 - > It would **assist benchmarking** of the sector's performance, over time and across the power sector utilities, thus **helping to identify areas for improvement.**
 - > Both have been developed by IIT Kanpur.






- Major Dhyan Chand
 - > India's highest sporting honour Khel Ratna Award has been been renamed Major Dhyan Chand Khel Ratna Award.
 - > It was earlier named after former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi.
- > He played an important role in helping India complete their first hat-trick of Olympic gold medals with wins at the 1928, 1932 and 1936 Summer Olympics.
- > He was awarded Padma Bhushan in 1956.
- > National Sports Day is celebrated on Dhyan Chand's birthday on August 29 to honour the hockey legend.





Abanindranath Tagore

- > Celebrations have begun to mark 150 years of this iconic artist.
- > He was the **nephew of Rabindranath Tagore** and was the first major supporter of swadeshi values in Indian art.
- > He First created 'Indian Society of Oriental Art' and later established Bengal school of art with the aim to counter English influence on Indian artists
- > He is widely hailed as the 'Father of Modern Indian Art'.
- Hiroshima (Japan)
 - > August 6 is observed solemnly as Hiroshima Day.
 - The Manhattan Project created two atomic bombs- the first one, called 'The Little Boy' was dropped in the city of Hiroshima while the second one, dubbed 'The Fat Man', was dropped in Nagasaki on August 6 and 9, respectively.





- Pensilungpa Glacier (Zanskar, Ladakh)
 - > A recent study has attributed the retreat of the glacier to:
 - > Increase in the temperature
 - Decrease in precipitation during winters
 - The study was conducted by the Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology (Dehradun), an autonomous institute under the Department of Science & Technology.

- Zaranj, Nimroz Province (Afghanistan)
 - > Zaranj became the first provincial capital to fall to the Taliban since the US has reached a deal with the group for a US troop pullout in 2020.
 - As a symbol of India's commitment to Afghanistan's reconstruction and rebuilding, India built the Zaranj-Delaram Highway.
 - Through it, India could extend supplies to Afghanistan via the Chabahar Port in Iran.
