1. World Theater Day

2. Reserve Bank Innovation Hub (RBIH)

- The Main Objective Of This Hub Is To Create An Ecosystem Which Will Focus On Promoting Access To Various Financial Products And Services For The Low Income Group Population In The Country.

3. National Dolphin Day declared

Recently, the Union Environment Ministry has announced to celebrate 'National Dolphin Day' on 5 October every year. Now from this year this day will be celebrated every year at the national level. Conservation of dolphins is of utmost importance as it serves as a perfect indicator of a healthy aquatic ecosystem.
