1. India Ratings decrease GDP growth at 8.6% for FY22



- India Ratings has revised downwards its GDP growth forecast for 2021-22 to 8.6 per cent from the consensus 9.2 per cent projected earlier.
- According to an India rating analysis, National Statistical Organisation (NSO) is likely to peg the FY22 real gross domestic product growth at Rs 147.2 lakh crore.
- This translates into a GDP growth rate of 8.6 per cent, down from the 9.2 percent forecast in the first advance estimate released on January 7, 2022.

2. Tripura CM Biplab Kumar Deb inaugurates Second Bangladesh Film Festival in Agartala

- Inaugurating the festival, Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb said that with the opening of new channels of communication including waterways and railways, Tripura is becoming the commercial corridor of North East and also providing huge potential for film-making.
- The three-day-long film festival at Agartala is part of the golden jubilee celebration of the liberation of Bangladesh.
- The festival is showcasing the best movies related to the liberation war of Bangladesh to commemorate the glorious history of 1971 and the role of India in the liberation of Bangladesh.



3. Ukraine's Parliament imposes 'state of emergency' to deal with the situation arising out of threat from Russia

- Ukraine's parliament has imposed a national state of emergency aimed at helping to forge a response to the threat of a Russian invasion.
- The measure was overwhelmingly approved on the same day that Moscow began to evacuate its Kyiv embassy and Washington stepped up its warnings about the chances of an all-out Russian attack. The state of emergency allows Ukraine's regional governments to adopt heightened security measures that range from tighter ID and vehicle checks to more stringent policing.
- They apply to all parts of Ukraine except for two Russian-backed eastern separatist regions where a deadly insurgency has killed more than 14,000 people in the past two years.

4. K.N. Raghavan named as new Chairman of International Rubber Study Group

- Chamba, in Himachal Pradesh, has become the 100th 'Har Ghar Jal' district, the fifth aspirational district to be covered under the initiative.



8. Dredging Museum 'Nikarshan Sadan' inaugurated by the Union Minister

- Sarbananda Sonowal who is India's union Minister for Ports, Shipping and Waterways and AYUSH has inaugurated Nikarshan Sadan" – The Dredging Museum at DCI campus in Vishakhapatnam.
- This museum displays models of different types of dredgers, vintage photos & historical milestones from the Eastern Port City of Vizag.

9. India's first para-badminton academy launched in Lucknow



- India's first para-badminton academy has been set up in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh. It has all the advanced equipment and facilities. The set-up will improve India's medal prospects at the 2024 Paralympics to be held in Paris, France at Stade de France stadium.
 - The badminton centre has been launched by the head national coach of the Indian para-badminton team, Gaurav Khanna, in association with Ageas Federal Life Insurance.



10. PV Sindhu wins title at Syed Modi badminton 2022



- Ace Indian shuttler, PV Sindhu has bagged the women's singles title at the Syed Modi International Tournament in Lucknow. Sindhu beat fellow Indian Malvika Bansod 21-13 21-16 to win her second Syed Modi title after 2017.
- The 2022 Syed Modi International badminton tournament was held at Babu Banarasi Das Indoor Stadium in Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh from 18 to 23 January 2022.

- Netaji was born on **January 23, 1897.** The day is celebrated to honour and remember Netaji's indomitable spirit and selfless service to the nation.

12. International Day of Education observed on 24 January



 The International Day of Education is marked every year on 24 January globally to celebrate the role of education in bringing global peace and sustainable development.



- The first-ever International Day of Education was celebrated on 24 January 2019 as per the resolution passed by the United Nations General Assembly on December 3rd 2018 to celebrate the role of education in development.
- The theme of 4th International Day of Education in 2022 is Changing Course, Transforming Education. The celebration is led by the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

13. National Girl Child Day observed on 24 January 2022



- In India, the National Girl Child Day (NGCD) is observed annually on January 24. The day aims to focus on the inequalities faced by girls, to promote the education, health & nutrition of the girl child, and to spread awareness about the rights of a girl child. The day was observed for the first time in 2008 as an initiative by the Ministry of Women and Child Development and the Government of India.
- The day was initiated to spread awareness among people about all the inequalities faced by girls in the country. The day promotes awareness about the rights of a girl child and increases awareness on the importance of girl education, health, and nutrition.



14. Former India footballer Subhas Bhowmick passes away



- Former India footballer Subhas Bhowmick has passed away at the age of 72 years due to prolonged illness. He was born in West Bengal. He was part of the Indian Football team that won a bronze medal at the 1970 Asian Games (held in Bangkok).
- He also scored a hat-trick against the Philippines in the Merdeka Cup in 1971. He has also served as the coach for football teams like Mohun Bagan and East Bengal.
